OSHA PUBLISHES PROPOSED RULE TO REVISE PROCEDURES FOR FIT TESTING RESPIRATORS

OSHA ISSUES ADVANCED NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULEMAKING: EXPOSURE TO DIACETYL

OSHA is requesting data, information, and comment on issues related to occupational exposure to diacetyl and food flavorings containing diacetyl, including current employee exposures to diacetyl. Maryland Department of the Environment

MDE -- On January 23, 2009, the Greenhouse Gas Emissions Reduction Act (MD S 278) was introduced to the Senate Education, Health & Environmental Affairs Committee. The act will require the Department of the Environment to publish and update an inventory of statewide greenhouse gas emissions for calendar year 2006; requires the State to reduce statewide greenhouse gas emissions by 25% from 2006 levels by 2020; requires the State to develop and adopt a specified plan, adopt specified regulations, and implement specified programs to reduce greenhouse gas emissions.

The Chapter Stars Recognition Program (CSRP) is intended to recognize Chapters that give their members superior service by providing quality programs designed to advance the professional growth of their members, support the mission and vision of ASSE and make a positive impact on the people, property and environment in their community. The program also serves as a comprehensive strategic plan and model for the chapter. The awards currently given under the CSRP are the Chapter Stars Recognition Award (CSRA) and the American Society of Safety Engineers Chapter of the Year award. Both awards are based on activities of the Chapter during each Chapter year (July 1 to June 30) captured through the Chapter Stars Recognition Program process.

NSC Calls for Nationwide Ban on Cell Phone Use While Driving

The National Safety Council (NSC) is urging U.S. businesses to enact policies against the use of cell phones and messaging devices while behind the wheel, encouraging motorists to stop calling or texting, and asking governors and legislators in all 50 states and the District of Columbia to pass laws banning the behavior. Motor vehicle crashes are the leading cause of occupational fatalities.

According to a fact sheet prepared by the NSC:

- More than 50 peer-reviewed scientific studies have identified the risks associated with cell phone use while driving.
- The annual cost of crashes caused by cell phone use is estimated to be \$43 billion (Harvard Center for Risk Analysis).
- Drivers who use cell phones are four times more likely to be in a crash while using a cell phone. (1997 New England Journal of Medicine examination of hospital records and 2005 Insurance Institute for Highway Safety study linking crashes to cell phone records).
- There is no difference in the cognitive distraction between hand-held and hands-free devices (simulator studies at the University of Utah).

Frank Drews, Assistant Professor of Psychology at the University of Utah, presented his findings at the May 2006 OSH meeting. According to professor Drews, research indicates that it is the distraction of talking to a person not in the vehicle that makes the use of cell phones while driving dangerous. Therefore hands-free cell phones are not a solution to the problem.

Many businesses understand the risk and are already taking action. Among NSC members that responded to a survey, 45 percent (651 of 1453 respondents) said their companies had a cell phone policy of some kind. Of those, 22 percent said they re-engineered their processes to accommodate the policy and 85 percent said the policy did not affect productivity.
