Take exit 67-A off I-95. After exiting, stay in right lane and exit off White Marsh Blvd to Philadelphia Road. The plant is located straight ahead at the end of the off ramp (the plant has an Allison Transmission sign in front and on the building). Turn left into the driveway. Parking is available in the visitor lot. Enter through the lobby doors and tell security you are with the ASSE Tour. You will be required to sign in.

- ◆ Cameras and laptop computers are not allowed.
- ◆ Wear long pants and sturdy shoes that cover the entire foot (no sandals, clogs or high heels).
- ◆ Safety glasses with side shields are required to enter the plant. You may bring your own safety glasses with side shields or safety glasses will be provided. All visitors will be required to watch a 10-minute safety video upon entering the plant.
